



BBQ VOLUNTEERS

INFORMATION FOR VOLUNTEER BBQ'ers

Volunteers are required to assist at Nippers on the BBQ

Anyone who volunteers for BBQ duty **MUST** have a Working with Children Check (**WWCC**) and at least one BBQ volunteer must Food Handling Certificate Level 1. For 2014 – 2015, this person will be Amanda Harper – the BBQ Manager.

Amanda will have ensured that all food is ordered and collected, and will carry her evidence of Food Handling Certificate with her at Santa Casa.

The BBQ Volunteers will be required to :

- Sign on.
- Wear an apron and gloves provided by the Club.
- Check that the gas bottle is full.
- Set up the BBQ in a safe area and make sure it is clean.
- Set up the trestle table in a suitable place near your BBQ.
- The food to be cooked will be in the fridge in the Beach Base.
- Set up the food to be cooked in an area away from direct sunlight and cover it from insects/dust etc. Clean tea towels will be provided.
- Make sure that bread and sauce are in the shade.
- Food should be ready to be served from around 11:00am. Aluminium foil and a tray will be provided.
- When cooking has finished, place any leftover food in the container provided (labelled BBQ leftovers for dogs) and place it in the fridge.
- Clean the BBQ and utensils.
- Store the BBQ and fold up the table as directed by Amanda Harper
- Place the tea towels and apron in a plastic bag provided and placed next to the fridge – they will be collected by Amanda Harper to be washed.
- Leave the pack of unused gloves with the plastic bag above.
- Collect any rubbish in the rubbish bin (labelled Nipper BBQ) and leave the bin as directed by Amanda Harper
- Sign Off.

The Club will provide –

- Sign on/off form
- BBQ and full gas bottle
- Apron and gloves
- Trestle table and chairs
- Cash box with change
- Utensils, aluminium foil, tray
- Food – sausages, bread, sauce – to be ordered by Amanda Harper and placed in the fridge
- Paper napkins for kids, wet ones for volunteer BBQ'ers; Cleaning gear for the BBQ
- Clean tea towels and a large plastic bag for collection to wash by Amanda Harper
- Plastic container for left overs – can be distributed or give to doggy owners
